HEATH AND SAFETY UPDATE - USE OF FOOTBALL PITCHES

A MAJOR SUSTAINABILITY MILESTONE

SOLAR PANEL INSTALLATION

Over the half term break, we are incredibly excited to be undertaking a huge sustainability project: the installation of solar panels across the academy roof.

Thanks to the hard work and strategic planning of the TCAT and staff at BCA, this project has come at no cost to the academy, yet it will save over £60,000 per year on our energy bills. Crucially, this saving will be reinvested directly back into educating our students.

I am particularly proud that our students have been fully involved in this project. Their enthusiasm and commitment have already led to the formation of a new Eco-Group, focusing on sustainability, environmental responsibility, and the long-term impact young people can have on the world around them.

This is a powerful example of student voice in action.
